SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...let me set it up.

SENATOR JANSSEN: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: A woman was slaughtered. A woman...listen to me, Senator Janssen, if you will.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: A woman was murdered by a man.

SENATOR JANSSEN: A man, right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now you are being asked to be a witness.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you say I saw a man, is that the same as saying I saw the man? No, it's not.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, no. No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I'll let you talk to your staff member...

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...because I don't want you to have to listen to two of us at the same time. Dictionaries don't resolve this question. There is nothing in this bill that says a person can carry only one handgun. Senator Janssen has pointed out that you can get a license to carry a pistol based on the one that you are trained and qualified to handle. You can get a license to carry more than one gun. There are categories established and nothing says how many of the guns in that category you can own or carry if you're qualified with reference to that particular kind or category of weapon.
