SENATOR JANSSEN: Could I think on that a little while, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, then I'll go ahead and close, while Senator Janssen thinks on that. I have several additional amendments that would take us down by increments. But, if I could find an amount that he would agree to, then I wouldn't offer all...I wouldn't offer each one of those amendments, one at the time. All we're doing right now is marking off time, I think we're all aware of that. But I genuinely believe that an additional amount of money is going to be necessary. So I would ask Senator Janssen this question, if he will ans...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen, would you yield?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, should I go ahead and offer another amendment, and we continue to discuss it, to give you time to think it through, or have you thought about it now?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, I've thought about it. And I would...I would accept the \$125, if you'll support the bill.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh (laugh), sit down, Senator Janssen. (Laughter) Talk about negotiation, he's asking me to abjectly surrender everything. No, Senator Janssen, no.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I guess, I guess I will proceed in the way that I had thought might be necessary. This particular version of the amendment would set the fee at \$400. So, we will have the opportunity to vote on that, and then continue the discussion as I try to bring us to a point where that fee can be increased. And maybe some of those who support the bill, I don't see two-gun Schellpeper over there, but he's somewhere on...oh, I...I just saw a gleam under the balcony, and I see it's Senator Schellpeper looking.
