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that's a high percentage, because it is an offense which obviously does not broadcast itself because we're talking about something which is concealed or hidden, like the occult. Now, if this number is 10 percent then you can multiply yourself to arrive at the likely number of persons who may be carrying concealed weapons in Omaha. An argument that doesn't make sense to me has been made by the supporters of this bill, namely, that these law breakers who currently are carrying concealed weapons should have the law changed to legalize what it is they're already doing. That's crazy, but that's one of the arguments and it shows the "Alice in Wonderland" nature of the discussion of something as irrational as a bill such as this, totally irrational. When you discuss something which is irrational, about all that a rational person can do is to criticize it, condemn it, ridicule it, and from time to time remind himself or herself that this is not taking place in bedlam. This is on the floor of the Nebraska Legislature, where sometimes there is bedlam, but this is not bedlam. I don't, for the life of me, comprehend how, with so much violence throughout the world, throughout this country, throughout the cities in this state, people can say put more guns inside of people's clothes so they can walk around with these guns hidden and that's going to improve a situation. It's like saying if a person is dying of arsenic give him or her strychnine. No, when you do something like that you're hastening the result that supposedly you do not want. Whenever a society...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...teaches that violence or the threat of violence is the means by which to solve problems, then violence obviously is going to be the ticket. And there is no need in pretending not to understand how actions of a Legislature can fuel violence and other unwholesome sociological currents. This is a bad bill. My amendment raising that fee from \$100 to \$350, I say again, may have the effect of discouraging some people from seeking these license.
