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another one from a person who is in law enforcement who talks about the fact that proponents claim there's been no law enforcement opposition to the proposed legislation...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...and very little other opposition. Their claim is true, he says, but only because opponents did not know about the meetings held around the state regarding the issue. Organizations, well-financed by gun and ammunition manufacturers, made sure their followers knew about those meetings. And he goes on to talk about all the different law enforcement organizations that voted, in some cases unanimously, to oppose concealed weapons proposals. I was just in Arizona this weekend and was out around in a neighborhood where they had a swimming pool and it was real interesting. They have signs posted on that swimming pool that has a gate around it that you can't bring your weapons in there. They have concealed carry in Arizona. One of my staff members was in Missouri this weekend, was driving down the highway, and that's where they have the big campaign to...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...to do the concealed weapons. Billboards everywhere for concealed carry.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schimek. For discussion on the Chambers amendment, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Lieutenant Governor and members of the body, Senator Janssen, or maybe...Senator Janssen, where are you? Senator Schellpeper.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Schellpeper, would you yield?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Could I ask you a question? Senator Janssen, as...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...when he was talking earlier, talked about
