SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR HARTNETT: What class? What level misdemeanor? I think there's more than one.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I think it's a Class IV, if I remember right. I'd have to look. I'd have to look in the bill.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay. A \$500 fine, I hear a voice behind me, and how much else? So there is...there is right now, is that what you're saying,....?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...Senator Janssen? Should we...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...should we increase that penalty, do you think? So...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, that would be a possibility, yes.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay. I'd give the rest of my time to Senator Chambers, if he so desires.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers, you're recognized for further discussion on your amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President, and thank you, Senator Hartnett, and I think you've raised a very critical question. I'm just regretful that it did not occur to me, but I just haven't taken the bill that seriously. I do think Senator Hartnett is entitled to an answer and, while Senator Janssen is having that checked, see what the offense is that a person is charged with. Is it...is the charge carrying a concealed weapon where a person is not authorized to carry it, or just how is the offense labeled? Members of the Legislature, if a person were to go through this bill and read it, you would see that there's such a hodgepodge here, so much chaos, that the bill is totally
