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SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...try to get them all, but I don't think...people are still people, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, Senator Jan...

SENATOR JANSSEN: They would go to any means to control them.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, that argument really has no bearing on what we're talking about in America, though, does it?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, this was just an article that I read from, Senator Chambers, like a lot of articles that are being read on the floor this morning.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But here's what I'm asking. If everybody in America was made to give up a gun do you think that the government would then start putting people in concentration camps, gas chambers, and burning their corpses in crematoria? Is that what...

SENATOR JANSSEN: I certainly hope not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...you believe?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I certainly hope not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think that would happen?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I hope not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you think it might.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Be...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You tremble for your country when you think that their guns may be taken, huh?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I would...I would be very cautious in having that happen.
