SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...after that time...after that time period. But I would imagine, Senator Schimek, that...thinking...you know, speaking for myself, that that...that their...they would be checked, their background would be checked a lot more thoroughly rather than, you know, if they hadn't had this problem before; that they would be scrutinized much more in the application process as to what their behavior has been while the three-year period was going on.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I understand that.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I imagine that you're right, but the point is they can get a...a permit to conceal carry.

SENATOR JANSSEN: They can apply for one.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: They can apply.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Right.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And are you aware, I mean I'm sure you're aware that there are some amendments coming up later on this bill that would increase the number of years after which you've served...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...your sentence?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, I am.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Would you be in favor of any of those amendments?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Not the way they are right now.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: You would not. Is there any compromise on that at all?
