SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Suttle.

SENATOR SUTTLE: Thank you, Mr. President. I would yield my time to Senator Kiel.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Kiel.

SENATOR KIEL: Thank you, Senator Suttle. Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I got some information I thought I would share. Most of you know that there is a ballot initiative in Missouri going on right now. And I thought it would be interesting to see if we could not break out exactly what had gotten spent on the ballot initiative in Missouri to allow for a very liberal, lax concealed weapon law, and would tie it to my contention that part of this has to do with trying to increase gun sales. So far the NRA has bought \$2 million in TV ads, and spent several hundred thousand dollars in radio ads, and it's estimated they've spent between 4 and \$5 million in trying to get this particular initiative passed. Now I have said to you that in my estimation this has a lot to do with increasing gun sales. And I have talked a little bit about some of the industry newsletters. And "Firearms Business", which is an industry newsletter, has said that the increased number of states considering carry laws the most important star on the horizon. Dealers around the country found that over 80 percent were selling more concealable firearms in those states that had liberal and lax concealed weapons laws. It's a good sign, especially for dealers who stocked up on concealable, low-cost carry guns last year. "Firearms Business" also announced that concealable carry bills were a positive direction for the industry. This is turning into an economic windfall in both gun sales, and in classes required to obtain concealed carry weapons permits. The indication is here that there is certainly a lot of money to be made for those folks who are funded by the firearms industry. Florida's relaxed concealed carry law
