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SENATOR JANSSEN: If they get caught, they will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I've heard...I've talked to some of my colleagues, and it's known that people are carrying weapons and they're not being arrested.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So what is this bill for?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The ones who want to carry them, are carrying them now and not being arrested, not being prosecuted, not being convicted, not being punished. What is the purpose of this, other than that the NRA wants something like this in Nebraska to raise the sales of guns? Isn't that really what's at bottom on these bills, such as this one?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I don't believe so, Senator. I believe that the person...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, sir.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...who is...who is going to...to be arrested for carrying a concealed weapon now, probably couldn't pass a background check.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Janssen. All these people carrying guns out there in the country, where they're terrified of their own shadow, Senator Janssen is saying they couldn't pass the background check anyway. But at the same time, he and others describe those as law-abiding citizens. They're carrying guns, and Senator Janssen now tells us they probably couldn't pass the background check.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All these inconsistencies. This is the chaos, this is the confusion.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.
