arrested for weapon-related offenses at a rate 22 percent higher than that of the general population of Texas, age 21-years and older. That...that seems to be an effort to relate a very specific kind of statistic that should be true or not true. And, if it's true, it would seem to indicate that the type of people, the type of personalities that apply for a concealed carry license might arguably be a more aggressive kind of personality than that of the general populace. I mean I would assume that, if this is true, that there...that the offense rate is 22 percent higher than the general population, that they are an element of the population that's more prone to being involved in a criminal activity of one type or another, than is the population generally. And so, if that were true, that would disturb me, because what that's saying is that people who apply for these licenses, not all of them certainly, but as a group tend to be more aggressive personality types than tend to be more likely the population generally of becoming involved in a...being the instigator of a criminal event. So, it seems to me I read someplace, and I can't find it, that these statistics were suggested to be otherwise by some other group, I assume one of the groups that's in favor of concealed weapons. And I guess I just wanted to ask you, before I go asserting that this is a very damaging fact to those who would have concealed weapons law, whether you had any...whether you knew of that information that contradicted the...the less...the presumed lesson in Texas from the law?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, Senator Beutler, you know, if this came...if that would have come from a neutral source, I could comment on that. But, as a rule, I think this is from a special interest group where you probably got this. You can, like I've said before, you know, you can get statistics to prove whatever your point is. But I believe in Texas there were, out of 100...I think it was 198,000 permits that were issued, and something like 600 were revoked. So that is a pretty small percentage of...
