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SENATOR JANSSEN: ...that were not arrested, but had their license taken away from them, for one reason or another.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Maybe those two sets are...can be correlated, though, in the sense that, although you can say that that's a relatively small percentage of those who had concealed weapon permits, it still may be a higher percentage of the population, generally, who's committing crimes. And so I would be interested in whether that fact is true, if you happen to have information that would reflect upon that? Because, assuming for the moment that it is true, I think it's very damaging in the sense that it shows the people who are going after concealed weapons permits tend to have more aggressive personalities, and are more likely to commit crimes than people who do not. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time. Senator Price.

SENATOR PRICE: Thank you. I yield my time to DiAnna Schimek.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I'd like to follow up on Senator Beutler's conversation with Senator Janssen, and also is the area that I was remarking on a few minutes ago. And it still boggles my mind to think that we won't allow people, who have been convicted felons, to vote until they've through a pardons process, but we will allow them to go out and get a gun and conceal it on their person or in their vehicle or whatever. And I would...I do have some information that says that Florida, in Florida where...we keep talking about Florida and Texas as being those states that we should emulate. But in Florida you actually...any individual who's been convicted of a felony is ineligible to receive a concealed carry license, unless their civil rights and firearm authority have been restored by the Florida Office of Executive Clemency. So they have got an additional provision in their law that we don't have in this particular piece of legislation that we're discussing here today. So I would definitely, definitely want to do something about that on Select File, if we ever get to Select File, that would say that, yeah, you do have to go
