SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Okay. Well, I'm going to oppose the amendment, 'cause I don't like the word "indirectly", because I think it opens it up too broad. I think this is something that was agreed to by a lot of the different livestock groups and for everyone involved. And I think we're opening something up here that doesn't need to be opened up. And it would be an area where "indirectly" could mean almost everything. So I would have a problem with that. I'm going to oppose the Beutler amendment.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Senator Beutler, if you would respond again.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR SCHROCK: By "indirectly" you're talking about surface drainage water, you're not talking about any underground water that may... Are you talking about a livestock waste facility that could be in a different watershed that could impact or something like this?

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, this has...this has no intent with regard to anything outside the watershed.

SENATOR SCHROCK: This doesn't...

SENATOR BEUTLER: It's only...

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yeah.

SENATOR BEUTLER: It's only intended to...to do what I thought you were intending to do, I hope you were intending to do.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Well, the bill specifically says that a map shall be maintained by the Department of Environmental Quality. And they have that map...we have that map on the north wall. And I don't know that I really object to what you're doing, I'm just not sure it's necessary. I can support it, or I can oppose it, it doesn't really matter, because the bill does include the
