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watersheds of the class A cold water streams. And I think that's pretty well defined. So, I don't know how to react to this.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well is there a definition of watershed someplace, Senator?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Well that will be kept by DEQ, and a map will be maintained. And I think this is pretty well outlined, here on the map, on the north wall.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The problem with the map is that it doesn't say what "watershed" means, which means you're leaving it to the determination of DEQ to determine what "watershed" means. And all I want to do is be sure that their map will always and ever follow the intent that you expressed here today with regard to what it is that "watershed" means.

SENATOR SCHROCK: And I think it would, and don't get my wrong, I'm not opposing what you're trying to do. But if you remember, our NRDs are based on watersheds. And I don't know if that language, that Senator Kremer was intro...had when our NRDs were formed, if it included watersheds, directly or indirectly? I'm not sure...I'm just not sure. This was sprung on us recently here, and haven't had a chance to review this too much. But I don't think I have a problem with what you're doing, I just don't know if it's necessary. So I'm not going to oppose what you're doing. And I guess we can analyze that. If there's a problem, we can do some of this on Select File. But it would be nice to get it right the first time around.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Dierks. Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I wonder if I could visit with Senator Beutler a little about this amendment.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, sir.
