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and that's what we're doing. But I think it is important that the department is given specific directions about what that map should show. I mean we're just going at this a little bit backwards in the sense that we have a map before the legislation. But the map should be drawn by the legislation and at the direction of the legislation, and the legislation will be dictating in terms of how that map is finally drawn. And I think we should simply clarify how it is we want it drawn. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the Beutler amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Members, please vote if you care to. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment to the committee amendments.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Beutler would move to amend with AM1039. (See amendment on page 1247 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Beutler, you're recognized to open.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Kristensen, members of the Legislature, this again is something that in reading the provisions of this committee amendment I thought that the introducers would want to pick up, and so I will recite what I'm trying to do. And if, Senator Bohlke, this is not in accordance with your intent, I have no interest in this particular amendment but it seemed to me that it should be included. It deals with that section of the bill that starts with the basic prohibition, that says, "No new class II, class III, or class IV livestock control operations shall be permitted in any part of" such and such a stream, of course, "except for", and then it talks about certain exceptions, one of which are "new livestock control facilities for which an application has been received and deemed complete by the department prior to January 1, 1999." That is, it's trying to pick up those things that are in
