it's feasible we'll be seeing 10,000-acre farms just to survive. You might make a penny a bushel. I don't know where it's headed, but agriculture is certainly getting on that...on that wagon and I can't see a way to stop it, although I am going to try to do some things this summer and fall per some legislation here soon to take care of it, but this is really an indication. Now no one wants to damage our trout streams. I'm not saying that. But the problem is I don't know whether we will or won't out there in that Scottsbluff area expansion, whether 90,000 head is too much or not. I would certainly think DEQ would have a...have at least an angle on whether those should be there or whether they shouldn't. I would trust them. But the point is to put into law what a certain individual can do. Already with the amendment is somewhat restrictive, let alone limiting it to 4,000 head, depending on the size. So I don't know that there's an easy answer. I simply wanted to call to your attention the difficulty. Are we going to put limits on how many banks there can be in the world? 'Cause we're headed for a very small number of banks. Are we going to put a limit on how many...how far agricultural seed companies can expand, insurance companies, all of these things? This amounts to that very same thing of limiting how far a business can grow, and that's where we're headed and I...I don't know that answer, but this brings out an issue in this particular bill of what the problem is, as far as I'm concerned.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Schrock, if I could engage in some more dialogue with you, I know it would be helpful to me and perhaps to others. Let's talk about how the trout streams need protection, what they need protection from or what it is that we're seeking to do here. But I suppose one way one might look at this is to look at the different kinds of facilities, waste treatment facilities there might be and systems, and I don't know them all and that's part of what I hope you'll educate me
