SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Am I wrong in that assumption?

SENATOR BEUTLER: In terms of these amendments...

SENATOR VRTISKA: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...that are being suggested? Well, the amendments try to treat the bill in terms of the concept that the bill uses to try to protect trout streams and, insofar as the bill at the very beginning chooses to protect a certain kind of stream or a certain geographical area, in doing that it departs from what has been our general procedure, as you have noted.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Yeah, I understand that part. That's...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...the part I understand. The part I'm trying to figure out is why we've gotten into this long debate about why this is more important to include this particular...this particular amendment into the bill. That's the part I'm having difficulty understanding right now.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, with regard to this particular amendment, there is nothing, there is nothing in...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...the permitting process...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Schellpeper, you are recognized to speak.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I'll call the question.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Question has been called. Do I see five hands? I see five hands. All of those in favor of calling the question vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record,
