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to me that if you're suggesting that if we don't do the Coordsen amendment, second and third and fourth producers would be able to inject themselves ahead is not true unless there was some kind of technical error in the first instance, and I don't think that's what the Uniform Commercial Code wants to endorse or support. I think we want general neutral principles and not to have people tripping over and failing on relatively modest and minor and technical descriptions of legal landholdings.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Okay, thank you. I was interested in this, I will run out of time, I was interested in this as it...as to permitting lenders...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Time.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...of last resort to support producers if their primary lender has terminated their credit. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Vrtiska, you're next followed by Senator Landis, Jensen and Chambers.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Senator Schimek. I just want to follow up on the discussion that Senator Brashear and Senator Landis have had. Senator Landis, if I might ask you a follow-up on this same issue.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I feel like Monica Lewinsky with the entire Ken Starr staff here cross-examining me. (Laughter)

SENATOR VRTISKA: Senator,....

SENATOR LANDIS: And by the way, this is I think soup. Okay.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...following up on this discussion, if as I understand it, and I've borrowed a lot of money in my life, but usually all of these, the bank that you borrow, they are all on file under...somebody knows they're there.

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.
