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the bill, when some of these, I think, actually improve the bill and specifically spell out some things. And I think in the beginning Senator Beutler has been very clear on those that are controversial and those that are not. And if this addition were added to the wording that would allow them in that case to downgrade a stream,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...then I really do think that this is a good amendment. And just...I don't know, because spawning would not be there, I don't think DEQ would downgrade a stream anyway just because spawning wasn't there for a year or two, for whatever reasons. But the long-term geological I think all of us would say would be reasonable. So if we can work on that in the next few minutes, hopefully the people behind the glass will say that they recognize that this is really just clearly pointing out the effective dates and the importance in the future, if there are those streams designated as class A cold water streams. And so with that, I have my light on again. And perhaps you and Senator Schrock and I could work out some additional language to this amendment, and then everyone could be supportive of...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. We are discussing the Beutler amendment to the committee amendment. Senator Schrock, you're recognized to speak.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, looking over this amendment, I'm not quite sure what we're doing here, because, if I understand LB 822, it says that class A cold water streams shall be designated by the Department of Environmental Quality. Now, we think most of them have been identified on this map. There may be a few additional ones and, as they come on board, the DEQ will add them to their map. I guess there's one stream in particular called Plum Creek, I think it's in the Long Pine area. But I'm not sure why we're trying to do in statutes what is already...would be assumed in the bill under rules and regulations. And so we're having a
