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amendment. And I'm not saying your amendment is bad, I just question whether we need it. I hope you don't mind me doing that on your time (laugh), saying that on your time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, that's fine. But, what you're telling me that in a legal sense you don't think it's necessary to include designations that occur after the effective date of the bill, in order to have them included under the purvey of the bill?

SENATOR SCHROCK: The bill says that the Department of Environmental Quality will maintain a map which identifies class A cold water streams. And, if new ones are designated and classified as class A cold water streams, they will be added to the map, and then the rest of the provisions of 822 shall apply to that area of the map or the state, whatever the case may be. Well, it's one and the same.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Let me...let me...let me take that into consideration and make a couple more remarks. First of all, this is not giving any additional authority to DEQ. DEQ already has the power to designate streams, and we're not doing anything to take that power away or to add to it. All we're doing is making clear that whatever they designate in the future will be included under the provisions of this particular bill. So it's not adding any authority to DEQ at all. Secondly, this particular amendment has nothing at all to do with zoning. This has to do with the permitting problem process that DEQ has with respect to livestock waste facilities, and has no relationship to zoning, as such, except of course to the exempted...extent that zoning is another local tool that can be used to deal with conflicting uses within a county. So, the...the point of the amendment, I think, is...is the...the objective of the amendment, I think, is quite clear. And I just wanted to make it clear that it's not intended to expand and does not expand DEQ authority, nor does it relate to zoning. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Schrock, on the Beutler amendment. Senator Schrock waives off. Senator Schellpeper, on the Beutler amendment.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, thank you, Mr. Chairman and members. If you go back and look at the map that's currently on the wall
