then, if you want to do something about it, what is it that should be done? The main thrust of the amendment is to be sure that we know what's happening with the trout streams, and that, if something bad is happening to the trout streams, we do something about it. I assume there's no point fooling around with this bill at all, if we're not really interested in protecting the trout streams. But how can you be interested in doing that, if you're not monitoring them, if you don't know what's happening to them? So it seems to me that there is a logical sequence here. Best management practices is a concept that is not applied uniformly around the state, nor should it be. Best management practices relate to what is necessary in order to protect the groundwater or the surface water or that aspect of the environment that is degrading. And if in one area of the state you need certain kinds of best management practices in order to control that situation, that's what you do. In other parts of the state you may need different practices, you may need less onerous practices, you may need more serious practices. And the NRDs now, with respect to the protection of the groundwater, are beginning to do that around the state. In the Central Platte NRD, for example, they have a much higher, they have much higher best management requirements than do most of the NRDs, because they have a more serious nitrate problem in the Central Platte area. So best management practices is not something that you're doing or you're not doing, and everybody is doing it the same. It's a set of practices that is appropriate to protecting the environment in a particular area, and at the same time not being too onerous for whatever industry is being asked to comply with best management practices. But, with respect to land areas and land applications of chemicals, DEQ, except in extreme circumstances, in situations that they rarely exercise authority, doesn't have...doesn't exercise day-to-day authority in terms of looking at best management practices. That, in a sense, in its closest sense, is the work of the natural resource districts with regard to the protection of groundwater. So what I'm trying to look at here is...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...an integrated kind of approach to a specific problem that we have all indicated that we want to address with regard to the trout streams, and the question is,
