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SENATOR BROMM: Absolutely not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Senator Bohlke, I would like to ask you a question.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is there anything in your proposed amendment that would grant undercover license plates to any federal agencies?

SENATOR BOHLKE: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, thank you. And, Mr. Speaker, what I would like to do is divide the question on the committee amendments. And if Senator Bromm would work with me, then we can see where the points are. This bill, and I'm going to tell why. At first, I thought the committee amendment simply struck everything from the green copy and all we would have to do is use the white copy. But since it strikes only certain portions of the green copy and I can't correlate everything that was given in the handout with what we're going to be dealing with, I want to divide the question so that we can take chunks of it and handle it in a coherent, manageable form.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers, before I rule it divisible, I would like to visit with you and Senator Bromm, if you two would please come to the desk so we can begin to look and see if it's divisible, and then, if so, how. We'll stand at ease for just a moment.

EASE

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The Chair is going to rule, Senator Chambers, that the committee amendments are divisible. However, the Chair is going to defer the physical division until a later time. I'm going to rule that we will debate the committee amendments as a whole until the Chair determines to its satisfaction what the physical division would be. Senator Crosby.
