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SENATOR BROMM: No, that's...

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...but I was assuming this was a follow-up of a bill that I tried to pass early when I was here that would make, in fact, the insurance companies give notice when somebody failed to continue their insurance policy. But this has nothing to do with that.

SENATOR BROMM: It doesn't do that.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay, then on this same section, what's the penalty if the...if they fail to file? Is there anything that speaks to that at all?

SENATOR BROMM: No, I don't think there is. I suppose if they were...if that happened numerous times or repeatedly, there could be some action taken by the Department of Insurance under their rules and regulations because they would be violating a state statute.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay.

SENATOR BROMM: But I'm not aware of any penalty.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay, okay, well, I was just curious and I was really just following up on what I thought the bill did, and now that you've explained to me, obviously, I'm not...and it's a piece of legislation I would like to see in place but I guess this bill does not include that, and so it's...there is not much need in us talking about it. There was one other question that I had and I've lost my place.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR VRTISKA: But if it comes to me, I'll either talk to you off the floor or on the floor as soon as I locate it. With that, thank you, Senator Jones and Senator Bromm.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers.
