I'm going to make it a five-minute opening for this portion of the committee amendment. Members, it is Section 1 of the committee amendment. Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and I think this is an excellent way to proceed, and let me say that over the noonhour we will provide some additional information to anyone who is interested with regard to the rest of the bill, backup information from DMV and further explanation. Section 1 is, I think, a straightforward amendment. If you look at the committee amendment, on page 2 of the committee amendment, it simply strikes these words: "Such a combination of a truck tractor and trailer or semitrailer shall not be used in exchange of services." Now this section deals, Section 60-330 deals with truck registration fees for farm trucks and commercial trucks, and in this section, because of the language that was in there, it was determined and enforced that farmers could not share semis during crucial times, such as harvest, because they don't have a For Hire plate on their farm truck. And a For Hire plate carries a lot of other requirements that farm trucks are exempt from. So there was a bill introduced to deal with this by Senator Matzke, and the bill had a little different idea, as I recall. It would have exempted, for a fee, farm trucks. It allowed them to do this for a fee for a limited period of time. And the complications of that were discussed and, in the course of the public hearing and following the public hearing, the consensus of people who were for that or against that or neutral was that why not eliminate this language which would then allow a farm plated truck to exchange services with another farmer, not for hire, but exchange services with another farmer in times of crucial need, such as harvest. And so that is the explanation of the amendment, and it's really...I would ask if Senator Matzke has any comments. I would...how much time on my opening do I have left?

SENATOR BROMM: I would yield that to Senator Matzke, if he desires to make any comments.
