SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time. Senator Matzke, yours is the next light on, followed by Senator Dierks, Jones, Cudaback, and Chambers.

SENATOR MATZKE: Thank you. So what this bill does is simply delete one sentence from the statute which prohibited the use of truck tractors and trailers or semitrailers in an exchange of services, which applies to farm, ranch and agriculture. And this is the approach, it's such a relatively limited technical matter that the committee, instead of reporting LB 146 out, added it to this bill and it appears at lines 5 through 7 of page 2 of Amendment 742 to LB 704, and I would ask for the adoption of this division of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature. I'd like to ask Senator Bromm, I think, a question or two.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bromm, would you respond?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes, I would.

SENATOR DIERKS: Senator Bromm, this...this deletion in the statutes in Section 1, is this agreeable to by the commercial truck drivers, too? Have they...

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR DIERKS: ...signed off on that?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR DIERKS: Okay, I have...I want to jog your memory a little bit. Two or three years ago I had a bill that would allow truckers to haul from north central Nebraska, for instance, dry edible beans to the Panhandle where most of these things are stored. And the problem is they need to be able to load in the field and not worry so much about the weight
