the area. These are not trucks that are 100,000 dollar rigs that go up and down the interstate highway from one corner of the state to the next. They're very efficient, as I say, second or third hand trucks that are used in the field and are primarily used in the sugar beet harvest, sometimes in the wheat harvest. Again, the wheat harvest is a time essential endeavor. When the combines come through, they get the wheat harvest in as quick as they can to avoid hail and other risks, and it's necessary to get the wheat out of the field and get it to the elevator. This used to be done, when I was younger, by two ton trucks but that's not efficient anymore.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR MATZKE: Now most of these farmers have...have semi rigs and they use those to haul their wheat into the co-op on a seasonal basis. And that's all this bill is meant to do, is to tell those people, those farmers, they can continue to exchange services with this kind of truck, does not permit them to get into commercial trucking at all. They can still exchange services with their neighbors and others living in their area, and it is not designed to let somebody who has got a 100,000 dollar truck rig get into commercial trucking. I would urge the advancement of this division of this bill.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bromm, you're recognized to close on this first division of the committee amendments.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I think we've had an appropriate discussion on this division. Everyone should understand what we're doing with it. We're allowing farm plated semis to exchange services with other farmers to haul farm products. I would encourage the body to adopt this section of the committee amendments. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the first division, the first component of the division, which is Section 1 of the committee amendment. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.
