contained in LB 1056. The committee was not aware that 1056 had that impact; I don't believe that anyone on the floor was aware that it had that impact, and we've since satisfied ourselves, at least I have and I think the committee has, that it is not...not something that we need to have in the statutes. It came into the committee as LB 303, introduced by Senator Coordsen, and I would yield any balance of opening I have to Senator Coordsen.

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Senator Coordsen.

**SENATOR COORDSEN:** Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Bromm, I think, outlined adequately what LB 303, now Section 33 of 704, was. And Senator Bromm and I did cosponsor LB 303 along with a number of other members of the body. This was a provision that applied to intrastate trucks, that is trucks that did not go outside of the state of Nebraska, both farm licensed as well as commercially licensed intrastate trucks, the same DOT number requirements and lettering on the trucks that was required by the federal government of interstate, that is those that travel across the United States, trucks. At the time this was done in 1056, as Senator Bromm indicated, we were under the impression that it was a federal mandate. We found that while most of 1056, that portion that dealt with hazardous material transportation was in fact new requirements of the U.S. Department of Transportation, that this was not, and it had been included in a way that led us to believe it was an error. So what we're doing, proposing to do with LB 303 is restore the situation in Nebraska state law to the federal minimum standards that are required by repealing the language that requires farm trucks, with a license capacity of over 16 tons, to have a federal DOT number and the owner's name and address and other identifying information on the door. So it was something, as I said, we did not knowing we had done it, and now we're proposing to clean up 1056 from last year,...
