SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, when this particular thing happened, was it felt that it was a good thing to do?

SENATOR BROMM: Well, we didn't know we were doing it. It wasn't represented outward.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Laugh.) You didn't know you were doing it?

SENATOR BROMM: No, it was not.... Here's...let me...can I explain a little bit?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: (LB) 1056, and the contents of 1056 that were involved with this area were represented to be necessary to comply with federal mandates or possibly we would be jeopardized in federal highway funds or whatever.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And, if I may, Mr. Chairman, who made that representation, if you recall?

SENATOR BROMM: Well, it was made...it was made to us by DMV and...and the Department of Roads.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Department of "Rogues", r-o-g-u-e-s?

SENATOR BROMM: No. (Laugh.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What was that now?

SENATOR BROMM: Yeah, okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, it was? (Laugh.)

SENATOR BROMM: But, Carrier Enforcement would probably be more specifically correct, I guess, as being involved in that issue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And they are the ones who probably thought that this was a federal requirement?

SENATOR BROMM: I think so.
