SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. I don't believe there's been anything that was passed last year that I got more phone calls from my rural constituents, farmers, with trucks than with this particular item has caused me. And you know, and when they called and said, I have to get a DOT number on my farm truck, well, I said, I don't remember that passing, but I'll check on that. So I called the committee or Senator Bromm about it and, yes, Senator Bromm said, I've been getting the same phone calls. Well, now, visiting with him and told me all that this was a mistake and that we were going to go back and deal with it again, they came with the problem of, well, I spent so many dollars getting this put on the door of my truck, and now it's not necessary, now am I going to have to take it off again? I said, well, I don't imagine you'll have to; you certainly aren't going to need it. And, you know, you sit there with egg on your face and trying to explain what's happened, and it puts a little more doubt in what we're doing down here. And it was...is unfortunate that it happened. And when Senator Coordsen came to the committee with this bill, I could see what had happened and understood, to a certain extent, the misfortune that had taken place last year. So now, Senator Bromm, will you answer a question for me?

SENATOR BROMM: Certainly.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bromm, would you respond?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.
