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surprise to anybody, a lot of things are a surprise to me. But I went to Senator Coordsen and he said that he would correct this. It was an oversight, and he's made good on his word here. And I just think it's something that we all understand and it needs to be corrected, so I thank Senator Coordsen for doing this. Thank you.

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Senator Coordsen.

**SENATOR COORDSEN:** Very briefly, I did forget to mention something. With respect to the federal DOT numbers and the lettering, those do not identify a truck. If Chambers Interstate Truck Lines has 5,000 trucks, they all have the same federal DOT number and the same name on the door. That identifies the owner of a truck, and it is used by the federal government to track trucks in truck lines in interstate commerce. It's not.... Its use, in intrastate, to the best of my knowledge, is negligible if at all, so I thought I might mention that, because it seemed to me that there are people that thought that that number did identify a truck. What identifies a truck is the license plate number and the registration of that truck. So this doesn't serve much of a purpose for state purposes.

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Senator Chambers.

**SENATOR CHAMBERS:** Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, Senator Cudaback may feel that the cud has been chewed enough, but I don't feel that the dead horse has been thrashed sufficiently. In the same way we were dealing with that concealed carry bill, for civilians, I was never in favor of giving these Carrier Enforcement people pistols. What that was designed to do, really, was create a situation where there could be more state troopers, in effect, turn these people into state troopers through the training and all of the rest of whatever hoops they had to jump through, then say, since they've taken all this training, you may as well elevate them to the level of troopers. This has nothing to do with truckers driving through there menacing these people. When the effort was made to give firearms to these would-be...well, I won't use adjectives that may not be appropriate for such a dignified discussion. Somebody said wallabies, oh, "wannabe's".
