within 90 days, I want to be informed. Senator Bromm let me know that he wants me to inform him. And I would hope that by the time I inform Senator Bromm, I will have corrected the situation and DMV will have received the materials that they need. So this is one of those changes in the law which discussion has established will not be necessary. I hope that I haven't left anything out. But in case I have, I would yield to Senator Bromm whatever additional time he may need to further clarify the issue.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bromm, you have approximately seven minutes.

SENATOR BROMM: No, that sums it up. And it was...it was represented that changing it to 120 days would accommodate the action of the Department of Roads in getting reports over to DMV, but in further discussion, and the only...the only objection I have is that Senator Chambers thought to ask the question rather than myself, as to why do we need this extra 30 days, and there really isn't a good answer for that. And I think it just puts people off on a decision that they need...they need to know as soon as possible if action is going to be taken. The one...well, one thing I probably should say, Senator Chambers, is that my understanding is if the DMV doesn't act in a timely manner, because they don't get the report within 90 days, then they really can't take action against the person who perhaps didn't have insurance. So it is vital, for action to be taken, that DMV receive it in a timely fashion. And I think that hopefully there will be great effort made to comply with it. I think that's a reasonable period of time and I support the amendment.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bromm, your light is the next light on. He waives. Senator Chambers, you're recognized to close on your amendment. He waives closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to the divided committee amendment. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.
