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to withdraw. We are following the terms that everybody agreed to. And the issues of bad faith have come and the other process, saying, well, you've sued us, you've sued the compact, you've sued the commission, you've done all these things. We did some really outrageous things. We wanted some different representation on the commission. That's not bad faith. We talked about some other just basic fairness issues that, really, other people agreed to and we've been mired in federal litigation. That is going to continue. We can't control that. But what we can do is withdraw before we have any exposure to being suspended or revoked. That would trigger the liability and I really would hope that we would choose not to do that. Thank you.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. President, members, sometimes we get caught looking in, and some of us represent a certain area, we really don't understand what's going on in other parts of the state, and it's hard to put yourself in another man's shoes. That's why some of the central senators don't understand what Senator Dierks or Senator Kristensen or now Senator Schrock is going through and others are representing those areas. We just didn't know. We sat back and said, hey, this is no big deal, but if you're in the area representing those people, it was a big, big issue, as Senator Kristensen stated. I'd like to ask Senator Kristensen a question, please.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Kristensen, will you yield?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Christian (sic), maybe you already answered this, but when you gave your opening or when you talked on it the first time, you alluded to the...being expelled, alluded to us withdrawing. Is this...at this moment, is this kind of a face off? Could they say, Nebraska, we beat you to the draw, we're going to expel you rather than you withdrawing, or is that a limited time, or is that...is it any date, or what is (inaudible)?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: No, there's...there's no...there is pending
