SENATOR BROMM: Yes, Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: You know, I'm just not sure, Senator Bromm, where to ask this question, but I think this is as good a place as any. Is there any place in the legislation that we're dealing with that Nebraska would accept the...I'm not sure if it's reciprocity or whatever, that the violations that Nebraska citizens have incurred in other states but don't appear on Nebraska records?

SENATOR BROMM: No. No.

SENATOR DIERKS: Is this a good place to put an amendment on that would do that?

SENATOR BROMM: It's...it would certainly be germane, I think, Senator Dierks. We did not have any component like that in our committee hearings so it has not been discussed by committee, but the subject matter is, if I understand the question, the subject matter is certainly appropriate.

SENATOR DIERKS: Well, I have always objected to anybody putting an amendment on that has not had a public hearing, so I probably won't do that. But I have an incidence that happened in my district where a young man who's a resident of my district had, I think, six violations in South Dakota, drunk driving, mostly accidents, and he had an accident in my district, hit head-on a family driving their van home from Boyd County. Fortunately, the people were not hurt and I think people consider it mostly a miracle, but when they tried to bring his record from...because they all knew he had the record in South Dakota, they couldn't. They didn't have the legal standing to make that any kind of an offense in Nebraska. And if he'd had those five or six violations in Nebraska he'd probably been locked up some place. The result was that the man who was hit was sitting in his office on Main Street in O'Neill one nice day and saw this man drive through Main Street. We called the sheriff. They picked him up and took him up to the county courthouse and then turned him loose and he's driving back down Main Street a half-hour later. I mean there's something really kind of sadly lacking when that sort of thing could happen. Here's a guy that's at risk for causing some very, very permanent damage,
