SENATOR BROMM: Well, well, I would argue, Senator Chambers, that the court would have discretion on where to remove it to in order to get it out of the possession of the repeat offender, and I'd want to give the court some flexibility in that regard. I would hate to say to the nearest towing station or to the courthouse parking...I mean I wouldn't want to be that specific either. So I...I...your point is taken, but I don't know that I want to be real specific on that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, from what...my line of questioning, I hope you can see that this is one of those bills I'm going to resist, even if they talk about federal funds not being given.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now I'd like to go to another part, in line...starting in line 1, or rendering of such motor vehicle or motor vehicles inoperable. What does "inoperable" mean? First of all, let me ask you a question. Would you be opposed to language which would say in no case does this mean intentionally damaging or destroying the vehicle or vehicles?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You'd be willing to accept that...

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...kind of language.

SENATOR BROMM: Yes, I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR BROMM: ...I would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I see other problems, but my time is running out.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers, but your light is
