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get and that you'll do anything to get it. And yet I hear people on this floor on other issues talk about values. That's why I get so disgusted with it. That's why I get fed up with religion, these preachers coming in here. Then we have poor senators writing letters to us saying, a preacher is coming here from a long way and we don't want him or her to pray in front of an empty building...empty room. Well, brothers and sisters, the preacher's not to be praying to us. The preacher is praying to the man or woman, or whatever it is, upstairs. That doesn't have to be anybody in here. And if they're praying only because of the senators, they're praying to the wrong target. That shows you how a person such as myself views and judges these things that are done. As politicians, we're in a position where we can be very practical, even utilitarian, realistic. We can see things as they are. We can name them what they are and deal with them as they are. The public is not going to be turned off with us any more than they are already if we frankly and honestly acknowledge that what we're doing has to do with money and we don't care about legislative standards of drafting, we don't care how it impacts on the citizens; we want that money. We will encourage the citizens to gamble,...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...if it's necessary to do that to get the money. We'll do anything. And then a little voice says, anything? And then we, in a thunderous voice, reply, anything, test me. And this is the test. But if you have any questions about my amendment, if you're aware of what it is, ask me. Frankly, I don't care whether you adopt it or not. I don't think you can bring a clean thing out of this unclean thing.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the opening on Senator Chambers' amendment so, for discussion on the amendment, Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Madam Chair, fellow senators. I have...I've looked at the Chambers amendment and I have...I have absolutely no problem with it. It simply confirms what our intent is and that is that, even though you might render a...if the judge would decide that a vehicle should be immobilized for a period of time, that does not mean that the vehicle can in any
