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who would follow these principles could be successful, to a marked degree. But people don't read what the man wrote. They read what people wrote about him, who either did not read what he wrote or misunderstood what he wrote, or had a deliberate intention to misrepresent what he wrote. The term "Old Nick" was a reference to him--Niccolo Machiavelli. And "Old Nick", which stands for the devil, was supposed to be a reference to him because he was so evil. The problem in this country is the lack of meaningful education. You can pick up a newspaper and see it revealed in the writings of reporters, in the writing of editorialists. They don't know anything and they figure other people who are going to read what they write don't know anything either. Yet, they will talk about and pontificate on issues of which they are profoundly ignorant and it makes it...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...difficult to read the newspaper for somebody like me, because I'm looking and thinking about all of the people who are going to be misled and think this is true just because they read it in the paper. When it comes to legislation, I don't have to be in that helpless position. I can try to improve it, or I can try to stop it. There's too much wrong with this. And I'm going to show where, in another area, they're saying we shouldn't have a two-tiered system of punishment, but then they immediately institute a two-tiered system for fines, because they don't want the people in their area to pay the high fines that others are going to have to pay. But I'll get to that in due time, brothers and sisters.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Madam President and members of the Legislature. In reading this section of the committee amendments, we're talking about immobilization and impoundment. Senator Chambers' amendment to the...to this portion of the committee amendments talks about the...he does not want someone to come in with a sledgehammer and start pounding on those vehicles. Now, now, certainly I wouldn't want anything like that either. Even, you know, our officers of the law hopefully are much more restrained in their judgment on what to...what the procedure would be in...in immobilizing a vehicle. In my
