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things have been tacked on or are attempting to be tacked on, and those are the ones that are really going to...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...draw my attention and my efforts to keep them from being added to the bill and, if they happen to be added, then try to stop the bill entirely.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, you may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, because Senator Bromm's amendment is self-explanatory, if you read it, it does have merit, I just want to touch on something on the front page of the committee amendments. So when I say the front page, I'm talking about the four pages that comprise the committee amendments. Now, on that front page they're talking about an open alcoholic beverage container, and this is a definition, and it's very interesting. It's designed to cover everything, and I suppose it does. For purposes of this section, open alcoholic beverage container means any bottle, can, or other receptacle. When you say "other receptacle", you include anything that is capable of containing something else, anything. Senator Redfield, you know what that could include? That could include a candy box with candy in it which contains alcohol. It could include a round cake tin in which you would find a fruitcake loaded with rum. And, based on the language of this law that you all are dead set on passing, those things come under this bill. The bill applies to them. The cake holder and the candy box are receptacles. The alcoholic content of these substances, it doesn't say the alcohol has to be...the alcoholic liquor has to be consumed in liquid form. That was an amendment I was just going to throw in there to help them out. But they're so eager to get these miscreants. I'm eager to get them too, but I say let's get them right if we're going to get them. We are the state. We are passing laws. We're not operating, supposedly, on emotion and a desire for vengeance and, because we can put anything in the statutes that we want to, therefore we ought to, that's not good. We should be very careful, we should be meticulous. And when we're dealing with the rights of people whose conduct we
