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to report to the law, if somebody uses the vehicle who shouldn't?

SENATOR BEUTLER: First of all, Senator, I'm dealing with a situation in a political context, obviously, and you would understand the parameters of that. But I suppose in the sense of encouraging some responsibility, if you're going to make an exception to the general rule, then perhaps the person for whom you're making that exception should exercise some responsibility in terms of what probably would be the public perception of danger, that is the danger that a spouse would just let the other spouse go ahead and...and use the vehicle...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, Sen....oh.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...and that would thwart the purpose, obviously, of what this is all about in the first instance.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But, Senator Beutler, if that were to be, by mutual agreement, eliminated, that wouldn't make you too much difference, would it, that part of it?

SENATOR BEUTLER: The sub...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Or are you insistent on having that?

SENATOR BEUTLER: The subsection (b)? You're talking about the obligation to report and the...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The part about not...

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, I mean if that's...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...acceptable to the body, that's acceptable to me.
