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some concerns about certain aspects of it. So I think probably the time-saving thing to do at this point is to simply withdraw it, and then it will be resubmitted in a different form, either now or on Select File, depending on how the work goes here. So, with that, Senator Crosby, I would withdraw the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you. No objections? The amendment is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: I have nothing further to this component, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Any further discussion on this section of the amendment? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I'm not going to have a great deal to say on this component at this time. But when it is added to the bill, there will be another opportunity to review certain aspects of it. But because of the willingness of Senator Bromm to cooperate at this point, I'm not going to bother right now about what we're allowing the court to do by way of exercising sound discretion, such as suspension of the registration, including license plates. Maybe that's the best thing, maybe it's a good thing, but I haven't really thought that through yet because I didn't know things would take the turn that they have, and I felt I'd be trying to defeat the entire proposition. So, at this point, I'm not going to even tinker with that. But I want Senator Bromm to know that I'm going to review it, and maybe I'd have some problems with it that right now I don't particularly see.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. There are no further lights. Senator Bromm, would you like to close on the first section of the amendment?

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Senator Crosby. I appreciate the work that was done on this section. I think I feel better about it now than in the committee amendment version. And we are continuing to work on the hardship section. I don't know when that will be ready, but when it is ready I will bring it back and distribute it to those senators who have an interest and those that I know have an interest, certainly include Senator
