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that I handed out to you, in the first year of implementation, 2001, amounts to, if we do not adopt it, a reduction of 1.5 percent of the funds, which is estimated to be 2.3 million, and the second year and years after that, depending on the level of funding, it would be 3 percent, or 4.6 million. I know that with this kind of a provision that the devil is always in the details. And, from what Senator Chambers said in our discussion on the first part of the committee amendment, I can see a fruitcake exception coming. And I have no problem with a fruitcake exception or exemption. But I know that these things have to be framed in as practical a manner as we can and still comply with the federal law. In plain language, we are saying that an open alcohol beverage container means a bottle, can, or other receptacle that contains an amount of alcoholic liquor; that it's open or has a broken seal, or that the contents are partially removed. And it is...it is unlawful for a person to have such a container in the passenger compartment of a motor vehicle while it is located in a public parking area, or on any highway in the state. Now, again, the exemptions that we have provided for here are exemptions that are specifically provided for in the federal law, and that is the exceptions of persons who are passengers in the living quarters of a self-propelled mobile home, or cabin trailer, and who are not operating that mobile home or that cabin trailer, or the motor vehicle towing the cabin trailer. Now, does that mean that they can drink it? No.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: Does that mean that containers can be there that are open in the passenger compartment of such a vehicle? Yes. And I...and...and...you know, I'm assuming we're going to have a considerable amount of discussion on that, whether that's fair, whether that isn't fair. You don't have to make that exemption. That's an exemption that's allowed, and that's an exemption that we incorporated into the provisions because it was permitted. Now, hopefully, everyone understands the crux of the amendment. I look forward to the discussion and any possible improvements to this section that you wish to make. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Discussion on the second division of the committee amendments? Senator Chambers.
