SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then let me ask you this, why is this allowed only with these mobile homes and these trailers that are towed, allowed in these...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...limousine and buses, but not allowed if neighbors are going to transport each other? It wouldn't be allowed in a private vehicle, would it?

SENATOR BROMM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What's the difference, if you'll explain it to me,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...other than that the law says there is a difference?

SENATOR BROMM: Right. I think, and I haven't got the debate that may have occurred at the federal level, but I guess my sense of that would be that where you have a hired driver or a company who's responsible for getting those passengers from one destination to another, that...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You mean like legislators going from the House to the airport?

SENATOR BROMM: Well, you mean...you mean in a hired vehicle or something?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, in Washington, D.C., right, where the ones who are putting these restrictions on us will write it...

SENATOR BROMM: I...right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...so that they, themselves, are exempted.

SENATOR BROMM: Well, but I think... Yes, and I understand the point. But I think the point that I'm making is that where you have a hired vehicle, a driver, it's unlikely that that...
