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SENATOR SCHMITT: Mr. President and colleagues, I stand to agree with Senator Chambers on this 100 percent. Jesse and the sheriff are on the same side again here. I think this is an issue that came about. I don't believe possession has anything to do with it. I think it's very clear, if you're in a vehicle, you won't have an open container. And I believe that's the way it should be. There's too many times out here where you have double standards, triple standards, maybe quadruple standards. A lot of people are treated differently because of who they are or where they may be. And I think this deals directly with everybody. A lot of times in law enforcement I think we deal with issues with minors that are different than the way we deal with adults. And I'm not sure that that shouldn't happen in a lot of cases, but it does. And I know that when we're talking about the parking lots at the university, I worked security at the university, at the football games, many times when I was on the Patrol. A lot of double standards over there. And I think those parking lots, it's illegal to drink in there now but, because of where it was and who it was, you were basically told to look the other way. And I think what Senator Chambers here is doing is being fair to everybody, and I think everybody on the floor here should support this amendment. And if Senator Chambers would like the rest of my time, I will yield it to him. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, almost three minutes left.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President, and thank you, Sheriff Schmitt. This is almost an intoxicating experience for me this morning. But what we're doing here, remember if you adopt this amendment, is not restricting anybody's use of a vehicle, not at all. You're not trying to tell them what they can do at either end of their trip. Prior to getting in the vehicle, when they start out, they can drink whatever they want to, provided they're not driving. None of this that I'm discussing relates to the driver. Even with the exceptions, the driver is not exempted. So I'm not talking about the driver. The people in the passenger portion of the vehicle, whatever kind it is, can drink until they are stone drunk. When they get to the end of the trip, they can do the same thing, if they're able. But it's that part in between where the public has an
