

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE
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SENATOR CHAMBERS: I said I don't believe even the senators know what is in the existing law now, and I'm going to see if you will help me prove that. Would you answer a question or two?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: He said one and you said two, which is it? Who's right, Senator Bromm, who is right?

SENATOR BROMM: Well, I think I'm right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You think or you know?

SENATOR BROMM: Well, I'm reading the existing law here.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you're not sure without reading it?

SENATOR BROMM: No, I'm just confirming it.
