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Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Debate on this portion of the divided amendment? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, my intent is not just to put Senator Bromm through a lot of heartache and pain. Perhaps there will not be enough votes to adopt this portion. If that's the case, then we ought to go ahead and find that out and get this off the table. And if it does happen to be adopted, then it's still a part of the bill, and I will then just attack the whole bill. But I, myself, based on the amount of work we did on the drunk part of the bill and actually made some changes that I think all of us feel were improvements, I would hate to see it jettisoned for something like this. But we'll just see what the vote is, and I'll accept a machine...oh, it's not mine...it's not mine to accept. That's all that I have to say. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Further debate on this portion of the committee amendments? Seeing none, Senator Bromm, you're recognized to close on this portion.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and I will accept a machine vote on this portion of the amendment. And let me say a couple of things about this. I want to make it perfectly clear that when this portion of the amendment was inserted, it was not inserted with any intent to do anything to one section of the state versus another. It appeared to be more of just some evening out process of the points assessed, looking at how the points were differentiated when the speed limits were lower, and sort of the aftermath of that, but I know it's a lightning rod. The rest of the bill is more important than this. The first two sections are much more important. It is not my wish to burden the bill to the point that we lose the chance to pass those first two sections which have been worked on and which have been, I think, put in a...not that there isn't more work to do but they've been put in a reasonable...a reasonable position for chance of passage perhaps. I mean that's the way I would look at it. This undoubtedly will make it much more difficult to pass the bill and so, certainly, I'm responsible for the amendment and I'm going to vote for the amendment. I will not
