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that's what this bill does. Be glad to answer any questions. It isn't that complicated. It just puts what the intention is into the law. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Debate on the advancement of the bill. Senator Chambers. Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. Senator Schellpeper, I just have one short question. This, actually what it does is puts the law the way it is and makes it so it's on the statutes that the Liquor Commission has the authority and not the village or the city to issue a license, is that correct?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That's exactly right and that's what the Supreme Court said had to happen.

SENATOR VRTISKA: That's what I understood and I wanted to make sure that that's what...exactly what this bill does.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: We're not doing anything more. We're following what's in statute from 1984.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Right.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: But it's, with all the other legislation that has been proposed, it needs to be put into statute what the actual law is.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, I only...I only got up to speak because you made a comment that many of the communities were not very happy with this and...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Well,...

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...I think we all know that, but there is nothing we can do about it.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That's right. We have tried. We had a constitutional amendment. The voters passed it.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Right.
