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the limit in the city is \$200, it's \$300 on the interstate. I'd like to ask Senator Bromm a question.

SENATOR SCHIMEK PRESIDING

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Bromm, would you yield?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bromm, by saying that anything above 21 miles per hour over the limit is going to result, on the streets and the highways, of \$200 in fines, but 300 on the interstate. We are dealing there with a maximum fine that can be assessed, no matter how fast you're going over the interstate...over the speed limit. So let's say in the city you're going 50 miles an hour over the speed limit. The fine is \$200, isn't that true?

SENATOR BROMM: The way the law is without your amendment, or the way the proposal is without your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you were going, and this is not likely, maybe in the city you could, 100 miles over the speed limit in the city, the fine is \$200.

SENATOR BROMM: Correct. You might get charged with something more, though, I would think.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You could.

SENATOR BROMM: Yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But we're talking just about...
