SENATOR SCHIMEK: Time.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...saying he doesn't intend to support his own amendment. (Microphone malfunction.) ...with his own amendment, which seems to me to be an interesting way to make law. Thank you, Madam President.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Beutler, you're next, followed by Senator Chambers, Jones, and Stuhr.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would yield my time to Senator Chambers.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Beutler, Madam President. Senator Coordsen, this is exactly the way that I play ball. When there is a bill that has a purpose, such as 585, and has been worked like we worked this thing this morning, then we have an amendment that has nothing to do with that part of it, but anything offered by way of a committee amendment is deemed to be germane, then I'm going to fight it, especially when it's going to tear up something that I spent so much time working for. So my intent, if this amendment, this committee amendment is added to 585, 585, I'm going to do all I can to kill it, because it's carrying something that I think is totally inappropriate and ought not be there. If what is being offered in this committee amendment is so essential to safety, and it was a bill, that bill should have been prioritized. But there are other things that were deemed more important. I've got bills that I think are important, but I didn't prioritize them, and I'm not trying to add all of them as amendments to other bills, especially bills to which they have no relevance. But I'm not playing that kind of game where, because somebody says I want this amendment, give it to me and don't attack it, I'll attack the amendment, if I'm against it, whoever brings it, whoever brings it and whatever bill it's attached to. So Senator Bromm can decide if he wants to test me on going to cloture on 585, that's all I need to find out. I'd like to ask Senator Bromm a question.
