This language would survive and, for that reason, I'm taking the language. You may not agree, but that's the provision of the amendments and I may have...if I can show them to you I will, John, but, in fact, I can't point to the line right now. I'll do it as soon as I can.

SENATOR HILGERT: Okay. And I'm certainly not going to turn my light on anymore. I don't want imperil the advancement of this bill at this time, but it is a concern that I feel that, frankly, I'm unsettled on as far as why is it essential that remove liability to such a dangerous chemical. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Further debate on committee amendments? Senator Dierks, you're recognized to close.
