manner at this time. And if they would be, that it would be a great help to some of the problems we're trying to address. So we're going to study that further. And on Select File, I know there will be discussion regarding perhaps this or other proposals in this whole area, but we spent a lot of time on the bill. We have two major components that have been adopted by the body and I don't know if I misheard the Clerk or if he misspoke, but only two components have been adopted instead of three, and so we're, at this point, if we don't adopt this component, there will be two components adopted, one dealing with open containers, and the other...the other measure dealing with the immobilization of vehicles for repeat offenders of the DUI statutes. So what I'm suggesting is this; we've got major issues yet to deal with on Select File, people want to file amendments, but I'm asking the body to not adopt this section of the committee amendments and move forward with the bill, and we will be willing to discuss and address other concerns on Select File. Thank you. And I...was that my closing on this section, Mr. Speaker?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yes, Senator, it was.

SENATOR BROMM: So I'm asking folks not to adopt this section of the committee amendments at this time.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the final component of the divided committee amendment, FA85. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 1 ayes, 23 nays on the fourth component of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: That portion of the divided committee amendment is not adopted.

CLERK: I have just one amendment to the bill. But, Senator Hudkins, you want to withdraw and substitute or withdraw and reoffer on Select File? I have nothing further to the bill, Mr. President.
