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gone ahead this morning and argued about it so we would be ahead of that. But the third thing, the other thing I want to assure people, is I don't have any doctors that I'm unhappy with. I don't want to walk into my doctor's office the next time I go and say, well, how come you don't like me. So I don't mean to be facetious this morning, but one of the things my staff is working on right now going through the bill is to establish who it is over at the Health Department now who is the group that you talk about that this would duplicate? Because it would seem to me that if there is such a group and it isn't just state employees, there are lay people who are on this advisory group, or whatever it is, that surely we wouldn't bring in another group and...that would be separate. You could meld the two or figure out some way to work with that group. The other thing, as I said before, I do think that things have changed as we go along, but it takes a long time and sometimes you have to get people's attention with legislation like this to make them realize that we can't just go along in the same old groove all the time, and so I don't see anything wrong with that in particular. Again, I do have the same misgivings as I had earlier about the fiscal note, because we are setting up more money to do something that should be happening now and, if it is not, then we need to know why not. So this legislation should wake up somebody over at the Health Department, if that's what we need to do, and/or, as legislators, when someone asks a question about how would we know whether or not we were getting results, Senator Schimek said, of course, there's a reporting procedure in the bill so that each year we would receive a report. How many of you read all those reports that we get? We get a lot of reports. I was in Appropriations last week. A question was asked about a certain agency. I said, you know, we just got a report on that. The answer's in that report. How many of you read them? So think about that because you're going to have another report and you're going to lay it aside or hand it to your staff and say do whatever you want to with this. Many of us do read them and many of you, and especially we read the ones where we have a particular interest, and so I do think those reports are important. But think the bill through and realize that this isn't just some whim. It's an idea that would help. As Senator Schimek started at the beginning, that the women of the family are the ones who are the promoters and the nurturers of the family and she needs to be well. So it helps
