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provide for some master planning with regard to women's health issues than it is to deal with the results of failure to deal with it. Cancer deaths, cancer, lung cancer has risen among women in the past 30 years. It's the leading cause of cancer deaths in both men and women. In Nebraska, the number of women who died from lung cancer exceeded the number who died from breast cancer for the first time in '93. We have a tremendous number of health issues that women face in the state of Nebraska and if you don't want to support this initiative because you don't think that it's necessary because women's health issues should not be addressed, then support it because you know that it saves money in the long run.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Time.

SENATOR KIEL: Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Kiel. Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I'm rising again to speak on this because I think that this...I think it's important that we give consideration to what it is we are doing and for what purpose we are here. Now, obviously, one of the reasons that we're here is to appropriate money to run the state and that's one of the things that we're talking about now. Another thing that we are here for is to legislate, to pass laws, to assess penalties for the disobedience of those laws, and, yet, the other, which has been mentioned by several speakers here, is policy. Now, I would submit to this body that we already have in place a policy that exactly duplicates what Senator Schimek is trying to do again, and I would bring up...I was...I was back in the back reading one of my favorite books, which is the OED, and thanks to, as a matter of fact, thanks to Senator Coordsen and the other members of the Executive body we have a brand new set back there, and I was looking up Occam's razor. Now Occam's razor's probably familiar to a lot of you. William of Occam was born around 1395, I think, and he was a philosopher, and one of the things that he was thinking about is how do you prove things, and Occam's razor essentially is the theory that, of all explanations, the simplest one is probably the truest. Do we want to direct the policy of this state? It's one of the obligations that we have. Now, the policy that
